None are to dance but the Perfons named, nor any Spectators to be admitted but by Tickets. The cold Weather continues, and the Winter is judged to be the feveress that has been known in this Country fince the hard Frost in 1709; which raifes the Price of every thing, especially of Wood for Fireing.

Turin, Jan. 20, N.S. Snow having newly fallen pretty thick, the Prince of Piedmont again diverted himfelf on the 18th with a Cavalcade of Sleds, which was more numerous and fplendid, than the former, His Royal Highnefs drove the Sled where fat the Princefs Ifabella di Carignan. The Marquefs Lufini is arrived here with a numerous Retinue and the Character of Envoy from the Governour General of the Milanefe, to compliment this Court upon the Marriage of the Prince of Piedmont. To Night there is to be a fecond Ball in the Princefs's Apartment, which is to continue twice a Week during the Carnaval.

Stockholm, Jan. 6, O. 3. His Swedifh Majefty having been prevented by a Thaw from performing the Journey he intended in order to take the Diversion of Hunting, returned hither on the last Day of the old Year at Night. On New-Years's-Day, at Six in the Morning, the Guards were drawn up, and ufhered in the New Year as ufual with feveral Difcharges of their Fire-Arms. At the fame time the Senators and refpective Colleges of this Kingdom, with the Officers of the Army and of the Court, waited on their Swedifh Måjefties to wifh them a happy New Year, as did the Foreign Minifters and other Perfons of Diftinction after Church, and M. Beftuchef, the Ruffian Envoy, had the Honour of Dining with their Majefties. At Night there was a Ball at Court, and a very numcrous Appearance of Perfons of Quality of both Sexes. The Joy of this Day was encreafed by her Swedifh Majefty's being happily recovered of a Pleuritick Pain, which it was apprehended would have ended in a Fever. The Duke of Holftein has notified not only to their Swedifh Majefties, but likewife to each of the Senators by Letter, his being contracted to the Princefs Anna Petrowna the Czar's eldeft Daughter, and his Minifter has. received their Compliments of Congratulation refpectively.
