Madrid, February 5, N. S.

ON the 30th past their Catholick Majesties with the Infantes and the principal Officers of the Court came, all on Horseback, to a Plain a League distant from the Pardo, and reviewed the two Regiments of Horse of Eftremadura and Malta which passed there, on their March to Quarters at Zamorra. They consisted of about 400 Horse each, and appeared in good Order. On the 1st Instant their Catholick Majesties came hither to the Palace; the 2d. being Candlemas-Day, they performed their Devotions in the Royal Chapel, and made a Procession through the several Galleries of the Palace; the same Afternoon they returned back to the Pardo. Some Days ago a Riot happened at St. Idesonso amongst the Workmen, which was occasioned by one of them having a Dispute with an Overseer and wounding him, upon which the Offender having been arrested, all the Workmen to the Number of 800 got together, demanding the Prisoner and threatening to set Fire to the Church and Palace there, if he was not delivered to them immediately; whereupon he was set at Liberty and the Workmen retired. The King has given Orders to enquire who were the chief Promoters of this Riot, that they may be prosecuted.
