That Day likewife, the faid Ambaffadour fent his Se-cretary to notify his Arrival to all the Foreign Ministers here. The Marchionefs, his Lady, came hither from Paris the 11th. Wilde their Minifter at Petersbourg, to make the proper Com-pliments to the Czarina, on the Death of the Czar, and on her Acceffion to the Throne. On the 10th the States of Holland difpoied of the Civil and Military Employments vacant in their Repartition, and particularly gave the Command of a Regiment to M. de Langerac one of the new Nobles of their Province.
