N the 13th Instant their Catholick Majesties with the Prince of Asturias and the Infantes came from the Pardo to the Palace here; and the same Day the Infante Don Carlos was taken ill, which Indisposition proving to be the Mealles, their Catholick Majesties, with the Prince and the rest of the Infantes, left the Palace on the 15th, and went to that of the Buen-Retiro. On the 21st a Courier from Paris brought the Marshal de Tessé his Recredentials, upon which he designs to take his Audience of Leave of their Catholick Majesties in a few Days, in order to fet out the 9th of the next Month for France. His Catholick Majesty has honoured the said Marshal with the Order of the Golden Fleece, into which he will be received To Morrow with the usual Ceremonies.
