The Commissioner proceeded to confer the Honour of Knigh'hood upon the Earl kneeling in the usual Form. The Statutes of the Order being presented on the Knee by Mr. Harris to his Lordship, were delivered by him to the Earl. The Ribbon and Badge of the Order were presented in the same Manner to his Lordship, which he put over the Farl's Neck who was ship, which he put over the Earl's Neck who was kneeling. His Majesty's Patent for granting to the Earl all the Privileges and Honours of the Order, and dispensing with the Solemnity of his Instalment, was last of all delivered by his Lordship to the Earl.
