## Lisbon, March 10, N. S.

N the 4th Inftant arrived here His Britannick Majefty's Ship the Lyme, Lord Vere Beauclerc Commander, in 10 Days from Genoa, but last from Gibraltar, whither she is' to return very fpeedily with Supplies for that Garrilon. At the fame time arrived a Dutch Man of War which came Convoy to their Salt Fleet, which is now at St. Ubes taking in their Lading, and with which fhe is to return.

Madrid, March 12, N. S. On the 7th Inflant the Marlal de Teiffé fet out for Paris, with his Grandfon the Marqueis de Maulevrier. On the 8th their Catholick Majesties return'd from St. Ildefonso. On the 9th a Detachment of Horse-Guards set out from hence for Burgos, in order to attend the young Queen Widow from thence, and conduct her to the Frontiers of France; the Day for her fetting out from hence being fixed to the 15th Inftant. The Marguel's de Valero, Prefident of the Indies and Lord Chamberlain of the Houshold, is appointed to wait upon her Majefty as far as Irun upon the Frontiers, where the will be delivered to the Care of the Perfons apwill be delivered to the Care of the Ferlons ap-pointed by the King of France; 100000 Growns in Specie have been brought hither from the Mint-Houfe at Segovia, for defraying the Ex-pence of the faid Journey. The Count de On-nate, a Grandee of Spain of the first Class, died on the 10th Instant; but leaving no Issue, his Essente to the Marquess de Quintana, who is likewise a Grandee of Spain.
