Stockholm, March 3, O. S.

ON the 1st Instant his Swedish Majesty went out a hunting, being attended by his Excellency Count Horn, President of the Chancery, at whose Country-Seat in Roslagen the King has taken up his Quarters. His Majesty is expected back To-Morrow or Friday. On the 28th past the Russian Minister received Letters from the Czarina, for the King and Queen of Sweden, notifying the Czar's Death and her Accession to the Throne; together with new Credentials continuing him her Minister at this Court. The common Advices from Petersbourg relate, that Prayers were ordered throughout the Russian Monarchy for one whole Year, for the Repose of the Czar's Soul, and at the same time Prayers three times a Day for the Czarina and the young Princesses. When the last Letters came away, the Czar's Body was still exposed to View on a Bed of State of Crimson Velvet with Gold Fringes, for the Muscovites (according to the Custom of that Country) to have Access to kiss his Hand. But the Corpse not being embalmed, it was then ordered to be put into a Leaden Coffin; and great Preparations were making for interring it with all Pomp in the Church of the Garrison at Petersbourg. The Czarina had established four new Councils for the Dispatch of publick Affairs, who are to make Report to her, and to receive her final Determination on all that Passes.

Dresden, March 21, N. S. Mr. Finch His Britannick Majesty's Minister, and M. Bulau the Prussian Minister are frequently in Conference with the King of Poland's Ministers, for obtaining Redress of the Infractions of the Treaty of Oliva; and are expecting his Polish Majesty's Resolutions on the Representations which they have made on that Subject. Prince Dolgoruki arrived here the 18th Instant, to notify from the Czarina the Czar's Death and her Accession to the Throne. Last Week arrived here M. Coppel, with the Character of Resident from the Landgrave of Hesse-Cassel.

Hague, March 30, N. S. The States General have received a Letter from the Czarina, notifying to them the Death of the Czar and her Accession to the Throne. Prince Kourakin, who is

now at Paris, has sent hither new Credentials that he had received from the Czarina, by which he is continued her Ambassadour to their High Mightinesses. The Squadron appointed for this Year's Service in the Mediterranean, being now in Readiness, M. Somerdyck who commands it, sets out from hence the 2d of next Month, in order to go on board and put to Sea from the Texel.
