**A**T the Court at St. James's, the 12th Day of April, 1725.

P R E S E N T,

The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

This Day the Right Honourable Sir Robert Raymond, Kt. Lord Chief Justice of His Majesty's Court of King's Bench, was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

His Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable George Earl of Cholmondeley to be Lord Lieutenant of the Counties of Chester, Denbigh, Montgomery, Flint, Merioneth, Carnarvon, and Anglesea, his Lordship this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy.

*Lisbon, April 7, N. S.* His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Lime Galley waits only for a favourable Wind in order to proceed for Gibraltar, as does likewise another British Ship laden with Stores from hence for that Place. Sen. Alexandre Metelo de Sousa e Meneses is appointed Ambassadour to the Emperour of China, in order to deliver him the King of Portugal's Present, which is embarked on board the Ship N. Senhora da Oliveira, bound for Macao, which with the other two Men of War designed for India, are detained in this Harbour by contrary Winds.

His Majesty has been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable WASHINGTON Earl Ferrers, to be Lord Lieutenant and Custos Rotulorum of the County of Stafford.

*Whitehall, Feb. 3, 1724.*
