The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

This Day the Right Honourable Sir Robert Raymond, Kt. Lord Chief Juftice of His Majefty's Court of King's Bench, was, by His Majefty's Command, fworn of His Majefty's moft Honoura-ble Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

His Majefty having been pleafed to appoint the Right Honourable George Earl of Cholmondeley to be Lord Lieutenant of the Counties of Chefter, Denbigh, Montgomery, Flint, Merioneth, Car-narvon, and Anglesea, his Lordship this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy.
