Madrid, April 9, N. S.

ON the 4th Instant the King and Queen with the Infantes went to Aranjuez; and it is said that the Beginning of the next Month their Majesties will go from thence to Pampelona, to receive the Infanta as she comes from France. The Marquess de Santa Cruz, Lord Chamberlain to the Queen, is appointed to meet the Infanta upon the Frontiers, and is to set out forthwith with the necessary Officers of the Household and Equipage.

Hague, April 20, N. S. Yesterday came Advice, that Count Colliers, Ambassadour of the States General to the Ottoman Port, died at Constanti-nople on the 6th of last Month. The said Count having a little before his Decease written a Letter of Recommendation of M. Fontaine his Nephew and Secretary to the States General, it is believed their High Mightinesses will appoint him to suc-ceed his Uncle in that Employment.
