# **ROAD RESTRICTIONS**

## LONDON BOROUGH OF LAMBETH PROPOSALS TO EXTEND THE CLAPHAM "L" CONTROLLED PARKING ZONE

[Note: This notice is about, the extension of the Clapham "L" CPZ to include the slip road sections of Clapham Common South side which are located on the south-eastern side of Clapham Common South side. On-street parking places via permit holders only past this point restrictions would be introduced in the extended CPZ. Objections or other comments may be made – see paragraph 8.]

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth proposes to make The Lambeth (Clapham L) (Parking Places) (No. \*) Order 202\*, under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

2. The general effect of the Orders would be to;

(a) extend the Clapham "L" CPZ to include the section of Clapham Common South-side which is not a red route and located on the south eastern side between No. 45 Clapham Common South Side and No. 55 Clapham Common South Side to No. 61 Clapham Common South Side in those lengths of road;

(b) This would involve the introductions of resident's parking places for vehicles in respect of which a resident's "L" permit has been granted.

3. that, unless otherwise specified, the parking places in Clapham Common South-Side would operate on Monday to Friday, from 9am to 6pm and they would not operate on Christmas Day, Good Friday or Bank Holidays (these operational hours are known as "the zone hours");

4. that visitor's permits would be available to residents to enable their visitors to park within the new and extended CPZs, teacher's permits would be available for teachers who are employed at a school within the new CPZ, trade permits would be available to tradespersons carrying out building, maintenance or similar such work at properties within the new and extended CPZs;

(Note: The parking places for vehicles that have been granted a resident's permit may also be used by vehicles that have been granted an appropriate car club permit, a visitor's permit or a trade permit; parking places for vehicles that have been granted a business permit may also be used by vehicles that have been granted a teacher's permit, and parking places that may be used after paying by phone may also be used by vehicles that display a health care permit.) 5. The proposed Orders are necessary to improve safety and the flow of traffic (which is currently hindered by the uncontrolled parking on-street parking space for residents and their visitors in the extended CPZ.

## LONDON BOROUGH OF LEWISHAM ELDERTON ROAD THE LEWISHAM (STOPPING UP OF HIGHWAYS) (NO.\*) (ELDERTON ROAD GARAGES) ORDER 202\*

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lewisham propose to make an Order under section 247 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 ("the Act"), entitled the The Lewisham (Stopping Up of Highways) (No.\*) (Elderton Road garages) Order 202\*.

2. The general effect of the Order would be to authorise the stopping up of an area of the highway located along the south-western kerbline of Elderton Road in the London Borough of Lewisham which lies between Nos. 27 and 29 Elderton Road, shown hatched on the deposited plan. The term "stopping-up" means that this area of highway would cease to be public highway.

3. If the Order is made, the stopping-up would only be authorised in order to enable the provision of the development described in the Schedule to this Notice to be carried out in accordance with the planning application reference DC/21/122703 granted on 9 September 2021.

## WANDSWORTH BOROUGH COUNCIL ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING BAYS THE WANDSWORTH (ELECTRIC VEHICLE) (PARKING PLACES) (NO. 2) EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2022

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Wandsworth on 16 March 2022 made the above Order under sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985 and the Traffic Management Act 2004.

2. The general effect of the Order will be to designate electric vehicle parking places in the locations listed in the Schedule to this Notice for the leaving of electric vehicles only at all times for the purposes of charging the vehicle.

3. Copies of the Order, which will come into operation on 26 March 2022, and of documents giving more detailed particulars of the Orders, can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the end of a period of six months from the date on which the Order was made in The Customer Centre, The Town Hall, Wandsworth High Street, London, SW18 2PU.

Whilst the Order remains in force the Assistant Director – Traffic and Engineering, or some person authorised by him, may modify or suspend the Orders or any provision contained in them if it appears to him or that other person essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic or of the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on the highway or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by the Order runs.
