HIS Majesty came this Day to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes seated on the Throne, with the usual Solemnity, Sir William Sanderson, Gentleman-Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers; the Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to

An Act for Redemung the Annuities of Twenty Five Thousand Pounds per Annum charged on the Civil List Revenues, by an Act of the Seventh Year of His Majesty's Reign, and for discharging the Debts and Arrears due from His Majesty to His Servants, Tradesmen, and others.

An Act for Regulating Elections within the City of London, and for preserving the Peace, good Order, and Government of the said City.

An Act for making more effectual An Act passed in the Parliament holden in the 12th Year of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Anne, Entituled An Act for making the River Nine or Nens running from Northampton to Peterborough, Navigable.

An Act for Repairing and Amending the Road from Biggleswade, in the County of Bedford, to Bugden, and through Alconberry to the Top of Alconberry Hill, or Cross-Roads, leading into Sauntery-Lane, on the York and Edinburgh Road, and from the said Town of Bugden to the Town of Huntingdon, and from Cross Hall in Eaton Sokon, in the said County of Bedford, to Great Stoughton-Common, in the said County of Huntingdon.

An Act for Vesting the Estates of the most Noble Henry Duke of Kent, in the Counties of Hereford, Monmouth, and Gloucester, in the said Duke and his Heirs, and for settling his other Estates in the Counties of Essex, Suffolk, Bedford, Hertford, Northampton and Leicester in lieu thereof.
