Madrid, April 23, N. S.

THEIR Catholick Majesties having received from the Czarina Letters of Notification of the Death of the Czar, they and the whole Court are gone into Mourning for one Month. Father Garcia, a Fryar, and late General of the Franciscan Order, who some time since was nominated by his Catholick Majesty to the Bishoprick of Malaga in the room of Cardinal Alberoni, who resigned it on Condition of retaining a considerable Pension out of it, having represented to his Catholick Majesty, that by reason of that Diminution the Remainder of the Revenues of the said Bishoprick was not sufficient for making the necessary Expences, and distributing Charities, according to the Dignity of that Station, and that therefore he declined from accepting the said Bishoprick, unless he was absolutely commanded to accept thereof, his Catholick Majesty has been pleased to discharge him from it, promising however to take Care of him when a better Bishoprick shall fall vacant, and the Vicar of Malaga has been named in his Stead, who has already accepted it. Sig. Grimaldi, a Genoese Nobleman, arrived here some Days ago with the Character of Envoy Extraordinary from the Republick of Genoa to his Catholick Majesty. Prince Galliczin, Envoy from the Czarina at this Court, having been recalled and received his Recredential Letters, is to have in a few Days his Audience of Leave of his Catholick Majesty, and immediately after he has performed that Ceremony he designs to set out from hence for Paris. His Successour Prince Sherbaroff, who is now at Cadiz, is expected here in a short time. The Archbishoprick of Valentia having been conferred by his Catholick Majesty on the Bishop of Barcelona, this latter See is given to the Abbot of Santander. On the 18th Instant his Catholick Majesty received a Courier from the Marquess de Monteleone, with Advice that the Infanta proceeded on her Journey hither in very good Health. It is said that the Court will only go as far as Xadraque to meet that Princess. Letters from Cadiz advise, that the two new Spanish Ships of War lately arrived there from Biscay, are in so bad a Condition, that it is very much doubted whether they will be fit to serve this Season in the Mediterranean, as they were intended.
