Whitehall, May 3.

ON the 30th past His Majesty received by an Express the important News, that the Treaty of Peace between the Emperour and the King of Spain was concluded and signed at Vienna. Count Starhenberg, the Imperial Ambassadour, received that Evening by another Express the same News. The next Day his Excellency had Audience of the King, and communicated to His Majesty a Copy of the said Treaty.

Whitehall, Feb. 3, 1724.
