EORGE by the Grace of God of Great Britain, France and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, Appertain, Greeting, Whereas by an Act paffed in the Seventh Year of Our Reign for raifing a Sum not exceed-ing Five Hundred Thousand Pounds, by charging Annui-ties at the Rate of Five Pounds per Cent, per Ann. upon the Civil Lift Revenues till redeemed by the Crown, It is (among if other things) Provided and Enacted, That it jhall and may be lawful for Us at any time, up-on one Quarter of a Year's Notice to be given under Our Royal Sign Manual, and affixed upon the Royal Ex-Charge in London, to redeem the faid Annuities, and e-very of them: Now We in purfuance of the Power gi-ven to Us as aforefaid, do fignify and declare, (in as much as Money sufficient will be referved in the Receipt of Our Exchequer at Michaelmas next 1725, to pay to the them Proprietors of the faid Annuities, the Confideration or Purchase-Money which was originally paid for the same, and all Arrearages of the said Annuities to that Quarterly Day of Payment,) That the said Annuities and every of them shall fland and be taken to be redeemed from and after that Day, and accordingly that the said Annuities shall from thenceforth cease and determine, and the Revenues on which the same are charged shall be then after discharged off, from, and against the same, according to the Directions of the said Act. Given at our Court at St. James's the Sixth Day of May 1725, in the Eleventh Year of Our Reign.

Stockholm, April 28, O. S. The King of Sweden went Yefferday to Eckolfund, a Royal hunt-ing Seat about 40 English Miles from hence, and will not return till the 4th of May. The Queen, who has been lately indifpofed, is preparing to semove to Carlberg or Ulrichsthal, both in the Neighbourhood of this City. M. d'Antoire, who has managed the Affairs of France here ever fince the Departure of M. de Campredon, is about hiring a Houfe in this City for the Ambaffadour who is thortly expected from France. *Turin, May 16, N.S.* The 14th Infant being the King of Sardinia's Birth-Day, his Majefty retired as ufual to a Convent of Carthufians at

Colegno two Miles from hence, and passed the

Day in Devotions. However, the Nobility and the publick Ministers went to Court in the Morning, and made their Compliments on that Occafion to his Royal Highness the Prince, and in the

Evening to the Queen. Lisbon, May 5, N. S. The Letters from Ma-deira give an Account, that on the 18th of November last they had a violent Earthquake in that Island, which did great Damage to feveral of the Towns there. D. Antonio Malcarenhas, third Son of the Marquels of Fronteira, was drowned a few Days ago in a Marsh, which he was endeavouring to crofs over on Horfeback. On the 2d Inftant the Infante Dom Carlos entered into the 10th Year of his Age; upon which Occasion his Majesty re-ceived the Compliments of the Foreign Ministers and Nobdiry. Yesterday His Britannick Majesty's

Ship the Lyme failed from hence for the Streights. Linbon, May 20, N.S. There are at prefent feven Dutch Men of War in this Port, five of which are under the Command of Vice-Admiral Somerfdyck, and form the Squadon appointed to cruize this Summer against the Moors. Two of them fell in with an Algerine of 46 Guns a few Days ago off this Coaft, but one of these Dutch Ships being leaky was obliged to make for this Harbour, and the other having had her Foremast shot away, the Algerine got off. Both the Dutch Ships loft fe-veral Men in the Action, as it is concluded their Enemy did likewife.

Madrid, May 14, N. S. The King having been informed, that many Abufes are committed by the Farmers and Collectors of the Royal Revenues, to the great Prejudice of his Subjects, chiefly by proceeding to Executions against those who can-not readily pay their Taxes, the Expences for which Executions frequently amount to as much as the Taxes themfelves, his Majesty has been pleased to make and publish feveral Regulations for the Relief of his People and for restraining the faid Collectors. This Town of Madrid having follicited the King to permit them to celebrate a Bull-Feaft in the Plaça-Mayor upon the Arrival of the Infanta, his Majefty has granted their Request-Whitehall, May 25.
