Lisbon, May 20, N. S.

**O**N the 6th Instant was held a Publick Act of Faith in the Church belonging to the Dominican Convent in this City, at which 38 Persons of both Sexes, who had been found guilty of Judaism and other Crimes, had their Sentences pronounced; but none of them were condemned to Death. Among them was a Physician, who being adjudged to the Flames as an unrepenting Jew, desired a further Hearing during the Act, and having made such a Confession as was required of him, was ordered back to the Prison of the Inquisition. His Portugese Majesty has been pleased to create Dom Antonio de Almeida, who is Nephew to the Patriarch and eldest Son to the Count of Avintes, Count of Lavra-deiro, and to make the Title Hereditary; which is the greater Mark of the Royal Favour, as there are but six Families in this Kingdom who enjoy Titles of that kind. His Majesty has also named Sen Francisco de Nobraga Governour of the Cape de Verde Islands; and appointed Dom Joseph da Cunha Brochado, to go as his Plenipotentiary to the Court of Madrid. The latter was formerly Envoy from this Crown at the Courts of France and England.

Madrid, May 28, N. S. On the 23d Instant, their Catholick Majesties with the whole Court went from Aranjuez to the Lake of Antigola about Half a League from thence; where there was a Bull-Feast in a Square on one Side of the Lake, by way of Rejoycing for the Conclusion of the Treaty of Peace with the Emperour. On the same Occasion, according to an ancient Spanish Custom, several Bulls, wild Boars, and Camels, were precipitated one after another from a high Hill called the Despennadero, down a sloping Bridge into the said Lake: And as they were Swimming, they were Shot by his Catholick Majesty and the Infantes. His Catholick Majesty has been pleased to honour Don Juan Bautista de Orendayn, Secretary of State, with the Title of Marquess de la Paz, in Consideration of his Services in carrying on the Correspondence with the Baron de Ripperda, who negotiated the Peace at Vienna. This Town of Madrid is making the necessary Preparations with all Diligence for a Bull-Feast, which is to be performed in the Plaza-Mayor upon the Arrival of their Catholick Majesties with the Infanta. We have Advice from Cadiz, that the Flota for Vera Cruz is getting ready to sail in July next.
