Lisbon, June 25, N.S.

ON the 25th past the King of Portugal, with the Infantes Dom Francisco and Dom Antonio, accompanied the Proceſſion of the Holy Sacrament through the principal Streets of this City; which were covered, and the Sides of the Houses adorned with Tapistry and other rich Hangings, upon the Occaſion. The 8th Inſtant being the Birth-Day of the Prince of Brazil, who entered into the 11th Year of his Age, his Royal Highneſs received the Compliments of the Nobility and Foreign Miniſters. The ſame Day His Britannick Majeſty's Ship the Durſley Galley, Captain Purviſ Commander, arrived here from Gibraltar, whither ſhe is to return very ſoon with Supplies for that Garriſon. The Mail expected the laſt Week from Spain, was robbed a Day's Journey on the other Side of Badajoz by ſix Horſemen masked, who rode off with all the Letters, having firſt ſearched the Poſtillion very narrowly, to ſee if any were concealed either in his Boots or Cloaths.

Paris, July 4, N. S. On the 27th paſt the King nominated the Duke of Orleans to be his Proxy for Marrying the Princeſs Mary's Daughter of King Stanislaus, and the Duke propoſes to ſet out for Wiſſembourg as ſoon as his Equipage can be got ready. The Rains which of late have been violent in this Country, ſtill continuing, the Parliament of Paris made an Order the 27th paſt for the Image of St. Genevieve to be carried in Proceſſion with all the Solemnity uſed on ſuch Occaſions; the Parliament themſelves, and the Magiſtrates of the City, being to attend it, for obtaining fair Weather; and this Ceremony is to be performed To-morrow. The young Queen Dowager of Spain arrived the 1ſt Inſtant at Vincennes, which is appointed for her Reſidence, accompanied by her Siſter Mademoiſelle de Beaujolois: The Dutcheſſes of Orleans went thither to receive them; and Mademoiſelle de Beaujolois came with them that Night to the Palais Royal.
