Turin, July 7.

SOME Days ago the Chevalier Ricardi, formerly Intendant in Savoy, was by Order of the King of Sardinia taken into Custody, and committed Prisoner to the Citadel. It is said he was an Accomplice with the Count de Salles in the Crimes of which that Count was lately convicted. The Chevalier de Pioffasque, Brother-in-Law to the said Count, was likewise taken up and committed to Prison; but has since been discharged upon giving Securities for his Appearance. His Sardinian Majesty went on Thursday last to the Veneria, whither the Prince of Piedmont and the Generals Rhebinder and Desportes went Yesterday. Next Monday Morning the King sets out for Savoy: His Majesty will take his Progress through Suza, St. Jean de Maurienne, Aiguebelle, le Col de Tannier, and Annecy, to Evian; where he will reside about 20 Days, to take the Waters of Amphion.

Pyrmont, July 13, N. S. His Majesty is in perfect Health, and the Waters agree well with him. We have had great Rains here, but now the fine Weather seems to be set in.
