Next Monday Morning the King sets out for Savoy: His Majesty will take his Progress through Suza, St. Jean de Maurienne, Aiguebelle, le Col de Tannier, and Annecy, to Evian; where he will reside about 20 Days, to take the Waters of Amphion.
