Stochholme, December 9. S.V. He second 'instant arrived here Monsieur Courtin from France, but continues as yet 'incognito; in the mean time Monsseur de Vaubeun hark taken his leave of their Majesties and the Regency, in order to his return home.

Milan, Decemb. 16. Our Governor the Duke "Offuns, hath lately by an Extraordinary Coutrier from Madrid, received, as we are told, inffructions from the Queen Regent, that he immediately veinforce feveral Gatrifon's towards the Frontier's of France, and put all things, as far as in him lies, in a good pofture of defence; to that now we difcourle of raffing more Forces, inflead of disbanding those already onfoot, as forme of the Nobility of these Countries frem fill to defire. His Excellency returned yesterday from Pavia and Lodi', where he had been to visit the Fortifications, and take a review of the Forces in Gatrifon there." The 24 past marched through Piedmonn, the remaining Troops y raised in those parts, for the fervice of the Crown of France.

Monsteur Clo continues still there, having, as is faid, received farther orders from his most Christian Majesty, for the raising 400 Foot more, besides those already raised. From Mantona, they tell us, that the Dutchefs Dowager was retired into a Cloyfler, and that the Count de Windistgratz, the Imperial Envoy, was gone thence on his return to Vienna.

Venice, Decemb. 18. We have advice here, that the Durchels Dowager of Mantoux, is lately entred into a Religious Houfe of Capucins, and that the Conte Bolgavino, is turned 4 Dominican Fryar. From Emirna they confirm the news, we formerly had of the Grand Signiors Brothlers death by poyfon, to which they add this faither circumstance, that he dyed the in Schtember at night, and as is alleadged, in the time when the Moon was in her late Ecliple, from whence the Superstition of the Superple, feem to raife ill Omens to that Empire; how, ever it is certain, the death of this young Prince, hash much fecured the Grand Signiors Government, to which the Generality of the People, feem to have as great an aversion, as they had love for the perfon of this young Prince, and an earnest defire to establish him in the Government.

Several Complaints coming to the Senate, against the late Proveditor General Bernardo, for matters by him committed, during his Government of Zane, G. they have ordered a Process to be formed against him, to the end, he may either vindicate his Honor herein, or give satisfaction for the extortions charged on hist.

The Duke of Manroua is fuddainly expected here, a Palace being in the interim preparing to receive him. The Duke de Nevers is realizing with his Dutchels to Rome.

Ratisberne, Decemb. 26. It is easy to imagine the trouble. our Commissioner, with several other Deputies of this Dyer, have, to find all their earnest indeavors, for concluding the matters of the Publick fecurity, and perpetual Capatulation; to hive been lo unfuccesful, that after lo inany Months debate, they leet no more advanced then they were at their first being brought on the Bord. In the mean time the Dyet hath appointed Deputies for the framing influctions, for a General to Confirm mand the Forces of the Empire, in case and occasion.

Franchfort, Decemb. 26. Here is at preient the Prince de Vaudemont, in order to the raising fome Troops, as he is doing in other parts of Germany, for the fervice of the Spanih Neatherlands. Some days fince paffed this place the Count de St. Gerand on his way to Berlin, whither he goes in quality of Envoy from his most Christian Majelly. Several Troops come down dailytout of Larraine; at state hath been layd up valt quantities of Corn; and other Military Provisions, for what design is yarign oufly reported. Cologne, Decemb. 29. As well the Imperial Commillioners, as the Deputies of the Circle of Wellphalia, have been in conference together with the Magistrates of this place, all these Holydays, for the finding out loine expedient to reconsile the difficulties made by our Elector, in several points of the late Project, in which they have advanced to far, as to give us new hopes of the final determinantion of thele matters.

Bruffels, Jenuary 3. On Thursday laft sector and hither the perfon, who as Math been faid, was landly Robbed near Beronne of his Letters and Moneys, as he was going Express to Madrid from benes. Our Letters from all hands tell us, of matters being ar length fairly accommodated at Colegne, but that that Elector continues his preparations still in the pare ordered to march towards our Frontiers; and fame manner as former ly, fo as it is not to be doubted, but he hath fome other design on Foot. Hague, Fanuary 1. On Wednesday fast the Deputies appointed for the Military affairs, by the States of Holland, met, for the first time after the Holydays, when it is faid, amongst other things, they likewife farther debated on the Instructions to be framed for a Captain Ceneral. The 28 inftant returned from Paris, the Express that was lately sent thither, with a Letter to our Ambassador there, to be presented to his most Christian Majelly from these States, onely with this account, that the faid Am-baffador had not a his departure, yet obtained an Audience of that King , in order to the delivering the faid Letter, but that he expected to have one after the Holydays.

From Nimmegen they write, that his Highnels the Prince of Orange arrived there the 25 initant from Aernhem, having been received by the Citizens in Arms, and faluted with all the Canon round the Walls of the place, all other Publick refpects, and demonstrations of affection and esteem, having been largely expressed on that occasion; from thence his Highnels intended for Emmerick and Rees, and fo for Wescl.

The 29 the Deputies of the States General had a conference with the Imperial and Spanish Ministers here. The Rhyngrave intends, as is faid, to go hence to morrow towards Wefel, and the other places on the Rhyn, where his presence seems to be every day more and more necellary, to Command the Forces of this State, and to have a watchful eye on the motions of all Forreign Troops, which we hear march dayly in confiderable Bodies towards those parts. The States General have appointed a publick Fast to be held through all their Dominions on the 20 of *Fanitary*, on the occasion of the present danger that seems to threaten them from abroad.

The Deputies of the Province of Friefland, have brought into the Affembly of the States General, the advice of their Principals, as the Deputies of the Province of Overyffel have likewife fince done, for the making the Prince of Orange Captain General, Oc. it being thought, the other Provinces will like- 1 wife readily follow their Examples.

Disso, We had expected that Monfieur Pompone, late Ambassador from his most Christian Majesty at the Court of Sweden, would on his return home from Hamburgh, have passed this place, in order to his conferring with the Ministers of these States, concerning the redreffing of leveral matters in point of Trade; But we fince hear, that he hath taken his way by Cologne ; from whence feveral Letters tell us, that things were at length amicably composed, between that Town and Elector; that Collonel Bampfield's Regiment was to leave the place, in whote room the Circle of Westphalia were at their own wost to keep a Gatrison there; that notwith-Randing this appearance of an accommodation, to an Honourable Peace.

there comes dayly more Forreign Forces down towards those parts, not without a design, as is feared, to make an attempt on some of our Frontiers places on the Rhyne.

His Highnels the Prince of Drange hath visited Aernhem, Nimmegen, Emmericke, Ge. having been every where received with much honour and relpect. The Deputies of the States of Holland for the Military affairs, are daily assembled, both before and after noon, being at present chiefly bu-fied about framing a new state of the War for the next year. We are told of more Forces that that the Regiment of Dragoons to be raifed, as part of the new Leavies, shall be Commanded by Collonel Brempt.

Paris, Fanuary 2. The Kings journey for Chalons, which his Majesty, as we are told, intended to have begun the s instant, is now put off till the 19, there being at the same time, those, who are of opi-nion, that it may after all, be deferred till about the middle of the next Month. His Majefty hath ordered nine Gompanies of Swiffers, so march immediately towards Montmedy, for the reinforcing, as is laid, our Garrisons on those Frontiers. The Sieur d' Artagnan, Lieutenant of the Kings Guard, being on his return from Pignerol, whither he had convoyed with a Guard of 100 of the Kings Muske. teers, the Count de Lauqun, is ordered to pass through Dijon, where he will meet the Kings Inftructii ons, how farther to dispose of himself. The Prince de Conde, hath lately sent into Germany, to buy there, about 400 Horses, to be employed as well in his own, as his Son the Duke d' Enguien's Regiment.

The Dutch Ambassador having not as yet been able to obtain an Audience of the King, which though not denyed him, hath been still put off from one day to another; it is faid, he hath by an Express. returned the Letter he lately received from the States; for his most Christian Majesty, and by the fame conveyance desired, they would fend him or a ders to return home, seeing his presence was fo useles here.

The Regiment of Horfe lately railed in the Territories of the Duke of Savoye, for the service of this Crown, is arrived at Bar on the Seine, where they expect farther directions from hence, whither to continue their march.

The Marquis de Chandenier, formerly Captain of the Kings Guards, hath been some days fince taken into Cuftody here, and fince fent Prisoner to the Chafteau de Loches in Tourraine. Our last Lerters from the parts about Cologne, speak of nothing but of an Accommodation between that Town and the Elector, fo that it is thought, they may after all, come to an agreement. We have advice of the Farl of Sunderland, Ambaffador Extraordinary from His Majesty of Great Brittaine to the Crowr of Spain, being arrived at Burdeaux on his way to Madrid ; and that at the fame time, the Marquis del Fresno had passed, on his way for England, in the fame quality.

Madrid, Decemb. 23. From Malaga they tell us, of a Report that was there, as if they of Argiers, had killed old Treky their new King, and let up in his rocm Tabarack Raiz, a Man more inclina-ble to an Accommedation with England, then Treky seemed to be. From Alicant, that there had arrived an English Frigat from Argiers, where the Captain faid, he left Sir Edward Spragge, about the begining of this Month, Treating with those People, with hopes of bringing them in a flort time,

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
