Edinburgh, June 26.

HE Malt-Tax in North-Britain commencing on the 23d Inftant, the Maltfters in and about this City gave ready Admittance to the Officers of Excife, to take an Account of the Stock in Hand. But the Officers who were to do the like at Glafgow, were obliged to fend Letters the 21ft to the Commissioners of Excile here, acquainting them, that fome of the People of that Town had threatned to ftone them if they should attempt to visit the Malt-The Commiffioners hereupon made Aphouses there. plication to Major-General Wade Commander in Chief of his Majesty's Forces in this Part of the Kingdom, who on the 23d fent two Companies to Glasgow, with Orders to affift the Civil Magistrates, as also the Officers of the Cultoms and Excile, in the Execution of their Duty, and to protect them from the Infults of Rioters. The Companies marched with great Expedition, and arrived there the 24th, between Six and Seven in the Evening. At their Entrance into the Town, they found a great Mob confifting mostly of Women and Boys, who gave them abufive Language, and threw Stones at t iein as they marched along the Streets, crying out no Malt-Tax. The Officer defired them to forbear, for he intended them no Harm. He applied himfelf to the Provoft, who gave him Billets for Quar-tering his Men, but told him he could not put him in-to Polfeffion of the Guard-Room, becaufe it had been locked up and the Key taken away by the Rabble when they heard the Soldiers were coming thither. The Officer unwilling to exafperate them by forcing open the Door, ordered the Guard to be kept at a publick House which he hired for that Purpose. About Eleven a-Clock that Night feveral Thousands of the Mob got together, and marched towards the Houfe of Mr. Da-niel Campbell Repreferentive in Parliament for Glaf-Buffiel who commanded the two Companies, fent an Officer to the Provoft, letting him know the Mifchief they defigned to commit, and that he was ready with his Men to affift him in preventing it; but his Anfwer was, that he thought the Number of his Solders was too finall, and therefore he would not make any use of them. Thus the Rabble finding no Oppolition, nor even the Appearance of a Magistrate to restrain their Fury, with Hatchets and other Inftruments forced into the Houle, and turned out two or three of Mr. Campbell's Servants (he with his Wife having the Day before retired to his Country-Houle) and fell to plundering every thing that they could carry away, and de-froying what was not portable. This Riot continued

till Nine the next Morning, when feveral of the Mob were lying drunk in the Houfe, with the Wine and Li-quors they found in the Cellars, but the Magistrates did not get any of them fecured. The Officers of the Excife during this Time were forced to hide, but fome of them being difcovered by the Rioters were beaten feverely. It was hoped, that the Rage of the Moh had been fufficiently gratified in the plundering of Mr. Campbell's Houfe, and till Three or Four in the After-noon following the Town in Appearance was very quiet, when the Rioters began to meet again, Women or Man in Women's Checke begins Draws show the or Men in Women's Cloaths beating Drums about the Streets to call them together. The Captain of the two Companies, not knowing what their Defigns might be, ordered the Soldiers to be near the Guard-Houfe, which the Provoft had opened for them in the Morning: But the Mob did not long keep their Secret, for they advanced towards the Guard, faying their next Butinefs was with the Soldiers: They gathered from all Quarters of the Town, began to throw Stones at the Soldiers, crying Drive the Dogs out of Town, we will cut them to Pieces: The Officers told them they did not intend them any Harm, but if they continued to provoke them they fhould not be able to refrain from firing at them: They answered that they durst not fire with Ball, and continued throwing Stones in fuch Quantities and fo large, that they broke fome of the Locks of their Pieces, and their Bayonets, and wounded feveral of the Men: Upon which fome of the Men were ordered to fire over their Heads, in hopes to terrify them; but they advancing still upon the Soldiers, and throwing Stones in greater Quantities, the Soldiers fired on them and killed or wounded three or four; upon which they retired to some Distance. In this short Interval, the Provost fent to the Commanding Officer, defiring him to fave himfelf and Men by retreating out of the Town, for the Rioters were collecting all the Arms they had, and if he did not fpeedily march away there would be a great deal more Bloodshed. The Captain ta-king his Advice, immediately marched for Dunbarton, being followed by great Numbers of the Mob, and fo clofely, that he was forced to fire now and then a Shot to fecure his Retreat out of the Town. He was followed fix Miles by 3 or 400 of the Rioters armed, but they durft not come up with him. Captain Bulhel has fent an Officer hither, from Dunbarton Caftle, to give Major-General Wade this Account of what had paffed ; and the Major-General has received the like Account by feveral Perfons come from Glafgow. The faid Officer relates further, that they mils fix of their Men, and that they left their Baggage (which he fup-poles is plundered) in the Town of Glafgow.
