## Madrid, fuly 13, N. S.

THE Beginning of this Month the Pope's Nuncio went to St. Ildefonfo, where on the gth Inftant he performed in the Pope's Name, the Ceremony of giving the Poffefion of the Abbey which the King has ereQted there, to Don Domingo Guerra Father Confeffour to the Queen. conferring on him the Title of Abbot of St. Ildefonfo, with Preeminences and Honours egial to a Bithop, and with the Income of one Thoufand Ducats a Year; the faid Father having refufed to admir of any greater Revenue, which his Catholick Majefty was defirous to grant. The Countefs d' Oropefa having been reftored to the Enjoyment of all the Eftates of that Family (which were confifcated on Account of her Husband's following the Emperour's Party in the late War, ) has been at Sc. Ildefonfo, where he kiffed the King and Queen's Hands, and was very gracioully received by them. The Employment of Lord Steward of the King's Houfhold, which was become vacant by the Death of the Duke of Efcalona, has been granted by his CathoIick Majelty to the Count of St. Eftevan de Gormaz eldeft Son and Heir of the deceafed: And the Command of a Troop of Guards which the faid Count has quitted, is given ro the Duke of Offuna. His Catholick Majefty has declared, that on the 27 th Inflant he urill come hither, in order to be prefent at the Bull Feaft which is to be performed in the Plaza-Mayor on the 3 oth On the grt Inftant the Count de St. Eftevan del Puerto (late Ambaffadour and Plenipotentiary of Spain at the Congrefs of Cambray) arrived here, and the next Day went to Sc. Ildefonfo to wait on their Catholick Majeftres. This Day arrived a Courier from Vienna, with the Original Ratifications of the late Treaty of Peace betwen the Emperour and Spain The Marquefs Mari failed from Cadiz fome Days ago. with a Squadron of five Ships of War, and having been joined by fix Gallies at Malaga, proceeded for Barcelona.

Paris, 7 faly 24, N. S. On the 1gth Inftant the Articles of Marriage between the King and the Princefs Mary Daughter of King Staniflaus, were figned here by the Keeper of the Seals of France, the Marfhal Duke of Villars, the Count de Maurepas Secretary of State, the Count de Morville Minifter and Secretary of State, and M. Dodun, Comptroller General of the Finances, commiffioned by his Majefty for that Purpofe ; and by the Count de Tarlo for King Stanillaus: And on the 26th Inflant the Duke of Orleans fets out Poft for Strasbourg, having a Procuration from the King to marry that Princefs in his Majefty's Name. We have Advice, that the Duke de Richelieu Ambaffadour of France to the Emperour, is arrived at Vienna. On the 2oth Inftant the Count de Ceref Brancas fer out from hence, being appointed Ambaffadour to the Court of Sweden.
