St. Jago de la Vega in Jamaica, May 31.

THE 28th Instant, being the Anniversary of His Majesty's Birth-Day, was observed here with all possible Demonstrations of Joy. In the Forenoon the Members of the Council, Judges of the Grand Court, and a great Number of Gentlemen of Distinction, waited on his Grace the Duke of Portland at the King's House, to compliment him on the Day. In the Afternoon the Regular Forces, together with the Militia, both Horse and Foot, were drawn up in the Parade, and reviewed by his Grace, and made a very handsome Appearance; and his Grace, attended by the Gentlemen above-mentioned, drank His Majesty's Health, the Prince and Princess of Wales, and all the Royal Family, and several other loyal Healths, under a Triple Discharge of the Cannon and small Arms. In the Evening a large Bonfire, erected in the Middle of the Parade, was set on Fire, and Illuminations were made in the Houses adjoining; and there was a very numerous Appearance of Ladies at the King's House, who came to pay their Respects to her Grace on this auspicious Day. Soon after his Grace, with the President of the Council's Lady, began the Ball, which continued till Two of the Clock in the Morning. There was likewise a very magnificent Entertainment provided in an Apartment at some Distance, to which the Gentlemen and Ladies were severally conducted from the Ball, in such a Manner as to give no Interruption to it. In another Apartment were a great Number of Gentlemen, who celebrated the Evening by drinking His Majesty's and several other loyal Healths. The whole Entertainment was with the greatest Order, as well as Magnificence, and every Way suitable to so Happy an Occasion.

Geneva, Aug. 13, N. S. The King of Sardinia, who had been some Time at Evian, set out from thence on the 6th Instant, and the 8th arrived at Chambery, where his Majesty intended to reside till the End of September. On the 9th his Majesty received Advice by a Courier from Turin, that his Grandson the Duke of Aoste was so ill that his Life was despaired of; and 'tis believed his Majesty will upon this Accident change his Design, and re-pass the Mountains sooner than he proposed. The Marquess del Borgo, his Sardinian Majesty's Secretary of State for foreign Affairs, passed through this Place three Days ago in his Way from Evian to Chambery: He lay here one Night, in the House of M. de Portes a French Protestant, who is a General Officer in the King of Sardinia's Service.

Turin, Aug. 11, N. S. The Duke of Aoste was brought hither lately from Moncalier, in hopes the Change of Air might have contributed towards curing him of an Indisposition which had been long upon him: But on the 4th Instant he was taken with a Fever, which increasing daily, he died this Morning, to the great Grief of the Court. His Royal Highness the Prince of Piedmont set out this Morning, to go to the King at Chambery.
