N the 6th Instant, about Eight in the Evening, the Queen of Pruffia arrived at Herrenhausen, and was received by His Majesty with the greatest Marks of Tenderness and Affection; her Majefty is attended here by the Count de Dohna Chambeflain, M. de Steinberg Councellour at War and Gentleman of the Bed-Chamber, and one of the Sons of the Count d'Ohnhaufen, as alfo by feveral Ladies of Di-ftinction of this Court, befides those the brought with her, who are the Counters de Finkenstein, Mademoifelle de Grumkau, and Mademoifelle de Bulau. M. de Brancas Minister from the most Chriftian King to the Court of Sweden came hi-ther lately, and fet forward this Morning for Stockholm M. le Coq Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Poland, is also come hither from the King of Poland, is also come hither from Drefden, and Baron Sparre Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Sweden from Stockholm. On the 11th in the Evening, His Majefly, the Queen of Prufia, Prince Frederick and his Highness the Duke of York came from Herrenhausen to the Palace in this Town, where a Freuch Tragedy was afted, and afterwards there was a fine Con-fort of Mulick, and laft of all a very entertaining Farce: In a few Days there will be a Ball in the Orangerie in Herrenhausen Gardens for the Di-version of her Prussian Majesty, who intends to thay at this Court about a Week or 10 Days longer.

Verfailles, Aug. 25, N. S. The Commandeur de Conflans, first Gentleman of the Bed-Chamber to the Duke of Orleans, arrived here on the 18th Instant from Strasbourg, to give the King an Ac-count, that on the 15th in the Morning the Cardinal de Rohan, Great Almoner of France, per-formed the Ceremony of Marrying the Duke of Orleans, as Proxy for his Majefty, to the Princefs Mary, in the Cathedral of Strasbourg; King Staniflaus and his Confort, and the Duke d'Antin with the Marquess de Beauvau his most Christian Majesty's Ambassadours, being prefent. On the 20th at Night the Duke d'Epernon, Grandfon of the Duke d'Antin, arrived, with Advice, that the Queen fet out from Strasbourg on the 17th. On the 18th the King took a Review of the two Troops of Moufquetaires, in the Park of Chaville: His Majefty rode through the Ranks, and faw them file off. On the 21ft his Majefty fet out from hence for Fontainebleau; where the Queen is expected the 6th of next Month.
