Modrid, August 13, N. S. N the 1st Instant in the Evening their Catholick Majefties with the Infantes went in great Pomp to the Church of our Lady de Atocha, to give Thanks for the late Conclusion and Ratification of the Peace between the Emperour and Spain. All the Streets through which they passed were hung with rich Tapeftry, and as they came back the Streets and Plaça Mayor were finely illuminated with White Wax Flambeaux. After their Return to the Palace, Fireworks were let off in the great Palace Yard. The Beginning let off in the great Palace Yard. The Beginning of this Month, the Count de Aranda and the Mar-queis d'Aterez, both of the Prime Nobility of Arragon, who for fome Time paft had relided here, were ordered by the Prefident of Caftile, in his Catholick Majefty's Name, to retire imme-diately from hence to their Eftates, which ac-cordingly they did. On the 2d Inflant in the Af-ternoon, their Catholick Majefties viewed from their Balcony in the Palace Yard three Souadrons their Balcony in the Palace-Yard three Squadrons of Horfe-Guards which are ordered to Catalonia; and after they had withdrawn, the Regiment of Dragoons called Terragona, confifting of 400 Men (which paffed by here on their March to Arragon) was reviewed in the Palace-Yard: They were very well mounted and accoutered, and performed all their Exercife, both on Foot and Horfeback. On the 3d their Catholick Majef-ties went to the Efcurial, where they defign to flay till the End of this Month. The Marquefs de Caffelar Secretary at War, and the Mar-quefs de la Paz Secretary of the Finances, have followed his Catholick Majefty thither. His Catholick Majesty has been pleased to create the Marquess de Valero President of the Council of the Indies, a Grandee of the first Class; and Donna Maria de Nieves, Lady of Honour to the Infanta and very much in Favour with the Queen, is created a Countels of Caffile. Don Francisco Ariaza Medina, Councellour of the Finances, has been named by his Catholick Majefty Prefident of the Council of Finances, in the Room of the Marquefs de Campo florido, with half of the Salary allotted to that Employ-ment; the other half remaining to the Mar-quels de Campo-florido, who by reason of his In-firmities is not able to discharge the Functions of that Office. The Marquels de Grimaldo, Councellour and Secretary of State, is recovered of his late Illnefs. The Prince of Cellamare, Mafter of the Horfe to the Queen of Spain, and Brother of the Cardinal del Giudice, is to fet out in a few Days for Rome, having obtained Leave to make that Journey in order to fee his Relations there: He intends to go by Land through France by the Way of Provence. The last Letters from Barcelona bring an Account, that on the 1ft Inflant there was a Meeting upon the Frontiers between M. de Firmarçon the commanding Officer of the French Troops there, and M. Duwan commanding the Spanish Troops, in relation to Deferters and fome Bands of Robbers which infest those

Countries ; and that in the faid Meeting they agreed upon feveral Articles to be observed for remedying the Mischiefs arising from Defertion and Robbing.
