Hanover, Aug. 20, N. S. On the 17th Instant there was a magnificent Ball in the Orangerie at Herrenhausen, for the Diversion of the Queen of Prussia; and his Royal Highness Prince Frederick danced often: All the Foreign Ministers and Persons of Distinction here were present, and her Majesty seem'd extremely pleas'd with the Entertainment. Yesterday Morning the King went a shooting and did not return till the Evening, having met with good Sport. On the 24th the Count de Broglio will begin to entertain publickly for three Days successively, upon Account of the Marriage of his most Christian Majesty: Great Preparations are accordingly making for that Purpose and among the Diversions there are to be a Ball and a Masquerade. The Weather continues still very wet, as it has been all the Summer.
