HE Cardinal de Rohan arrived here the 28th past from Strasbourg, and on the 30th proceeded to Fontainebleau. Bread being very dear at present, the Parliament of Paris have caused an Arrêt to be published, order-ing that from the 27th of August last (the Date of that Airêt) the Allowance for Victuals to Prisoners for Debt should be increased from five to seven Sols a Day to each Prisoner, to be paid by their Sols a Day to each renown, to be paid Arrêt Creditors, who are commanded by the faid Arrêt has been pleased to promote M.
