Fontainebleau, September 7, N. S.

ON the 4th Instant the King met the Queen on this Side of Montereau, accompanied her to Moret, and then returned hither. The 5th about Eight a-Clock in the Morning, the Queen arrived here from Moret, and entering her Apartment remained there till One, to rest herself, and to prepare to go to Chapel with all the Pomp suitable to the Occasion. The Musick and Heralds began the Procession from the King's Apartment through Francis the First's Gallery to the Chapel: These were followed by the Knights of the Holy Ghost, not in the Habits of the Order, but all dress'd in the utmost Magnificence. The Prince of Conti and the Counts of Charolois and of Clermont immediately preceded the King; the Dukes of Orleans and of Bourbon supported the Queen. His most Christian Majesty was in a Suit of Gold Brocade, with a short Golden Robe of the Order: His Star and Holy Ghost were of Diamonds, as were the Buttons of his Coat, and the large Diamond that was formerly purchased of Governour Pitt made the Button for his Hat. The Queen having a small Crown on her Head, advanced slowly under the Weight of her Royal Garments, her Train being held by the Dutcheſs of Bourbon and other Princesses. Her Majesty was followed by the Dutcheſs of Orleans, the Princesses of Conti; and the Ladies of the Court closed the March. The Cardinal de Rohan performed the Ceremony of giving the Nuptial Benediction, with an Exhortation to their most Christian Majesties. The Royal Couple dined afterwards in publick, the Princesses of the Blood being admitted at the Table. In the Evening their Majesties were entertained with a Comedy, and a fine Firework: Sixty two thousand Lamps, placed in Rows, were distributed through the Parterre of the Garden. Their Majesties supped in Publick; and about One in the Morning retired. On the 6th about Noon their most Christian Majesties went to Chapel, dined by themselves in Ceremony; and in the Evening took a Turn in the Park, the Queen in a Phaeton, the King and all the Gentlemen on Horseback: At Night there was a Conſort of Musick, and a publick Apartment. The Beginning of next Week will be employed in receiving the publick Compliments: And then the Court is to go into a short Mourning for the Duke of Aoste.

Hannover, Aug. 27, O. S. His Majesty having been pleased to appoint Cyrill Wich, Esq; to be his Envoy Extraordinary to the Cities of Hambourg, Lubeck, and Bremen, he is gone to Hambourg. General Diemer late Minister from the Landgrave of Hesse-Cassel to the Court of Sweden, arrived here some Days ago from Denmark. Baron Sohlenthal, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Denmark, will set out this Evening for Sleswick to attend there the King his Master. Prince George of Hesse-Cassel went from hence Yesterday Morning; Prince William his Brother is still here. The Count de Broglio, Ambassadour Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from his most Christian Majesty, has entertained in a most splendid

Manner the Nobility, Gentry, and foreign Ministers here, on Occasion of the Marriage of the King his Master. The Queen of Prussia continues here. Colonel Dubourgay, His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary to the Court of Prussia, intends to set out from hence on Monday next for Berlin.
