LETTERS from Cadiz relate, that a Ship called our Lady of Conception and St. Joseph, belonging to Don Andrew Martinez de Murguia, which could not be laden and got ready to go with the Flota for New-Spain that failed in July, put to Sea on the 25th of last Month; as did likewise at the same time an Advice-Ship, for New-Spain; they are to be conveyed by a Man of War as far as the Canary Islands. His Catholick Majesty has made the Marquess de Valero President of the Council of the Indies, a Grandee of the first Rank, and also created him Duke of Arion. The Duke of St. Blas, a Sicilian Nobleman, (who in the late War in Sicily levied a Regiment which he commanded as Colonel in the King of Spain's Service, and afterwards came hither) is newly made Exempt in the Italian Troop of Horse-Guards; and it is said that he is to be Married to Donna Laura the Queen's Nurse's Daughter, who was formerly Married to the Marquess de Monteleon's Son, but upon certain Allegations and Proofs was divorced some Months ago. Orders have been given by their Catholick Majesties for the fitting up a House in a Village near St Ildefonso, for the Residence of the Emperour's Ambassadour, who is expected here by the latter End of this Month. By Letters from Cadiz of the 28th past it is advised, that the Transports with two Regiments from Ireland, arrived three Days before at Gibraltar.
