The Prince de Mazerano, an Italian Nobleman, and Captain of the Halberdiers at this Court, has obtained Leave of his Majesty to go to Italy for some Time. His Catholick Majesty has declared his Determination that the Contractation-House and Commerce for the West-Indies shall be removed from Cadiz to Seville; and has also appointed Don Joseph Varas President of the said Contractation. House at Seville, in the Room of Don Joseph Patino Superintendant of the Spanish Marine, who had the said Presidentship at Cadiz. After the Marquess de Grimaldo went to St. Ildesonso, the two Portuguese Ministers likewise went to Segovia, in order to be near the Court for carrying on (through the Hands of the said Marquess) the Negotiation of the intended Marriages, between the Prince of Asturias and the Infanta of Portugal, and between the Prince of Brazil and the Infanta of Spain. Three Days after the Arrival of the faid Marquess at St. Ildefonso, he was again taken ill, so as to be obliged to keep his Bed; but he is now much better. The Marquess de Castelar is likewise recovered of his late Indisposition. One M.
