Madrid, September 24, N. S.

ON the 19th Instant a Courier from Vienna arrived at St. Ildefonso with the Ratification of the Peace concluded between the Empire and the King of Spain, and on the 22d it was published here with the usual Ceremony. At the same Time it was proclaimed, That the confiscated Estates of the Persons who followed the Emperour's Party in the late Wars, shall be forthwith restored to them. The Estate of the Duke de Uçeda which was confiscated and granted to the Duke de St. Pierre, having been restored to the former, his Catholick Majesty has been pleased to assign to the Duke de St. Pierre the Sum of four thousand Pistoles to be paid out of his Treasury, in order to make some Amends to him for the Loss of the Revenue of the said Estate. Mr. Tobit Burg, of Ireland, who has been for some Years in his Catholick Majesty's Service, has obtained a Pension of five hundred Pistoles per Annum, in Lieu of the Revenue of a confiscated Estate in Valencia, which is to be restored to the Owner. Yesterday the Prince de Cellamare set out for Barcelona, from whence he will go through France to Genoa, and thence proceed to Rome. The Infanta having been taken ill of a Fever, it is apprehended that it may turn to the Small Pox.

Turin, Sept. 29, N. S. The King and the Royal Family continue at the Veneria. On the 24th Instant the Chevalier Ricardi, who was Intendant of Savoy during the Time of the Plague at Marseilles, was brought to his Tryal, upon an Accusation that he connived then at the Conveyance of some Goods from Dauphiné into Savoy, notwithstanding the Barrier settled and the strict Orders given for preventing the spreading of the Contagion by Goods brought from infected Places: And being found guilty, Sentence of Death was passed upon him. But his Sardinian Majesty has thought fit to spare his Life, and to order him to be kept confined in the Village of Brigha, situate in the Mountains of the Col de Tende. The King has nominated the Advocate General Sicardi, who is now his Majesty's Minister at Vienna, to be President of the Senate of Nice.

Stockholm, Sept. 8. On the 4th Instant Count Gollovin the New Muscovite Envoy, had his Audience at this Court, to which he was introduced as usual by M. Cronstrom Under-Master of the Ceremonies: He spoke in the Russian Language,

and was answered in the Swedish. The late Accounts from most Parts of this Kingdom, agree, that notwithstanding the Coldness and Inconstancy of the Weather, they have generally got in all their Corn in a pretty good Condition; and in most Provinces it yields so abundantly, that the Price is already fallen 30 per Cent. Letters which came in Yesterday from Malmoe, advise, that Count Brancas, Minister from the Court of France, came over the Sound to Helsingbourg the last of August; and proceeded on his Journey hither the next Day, so that it is reckoned he will be here the 11th Instant.

Copenhagen, Sept. 25, N. S. On the 22d Instant in the Evening the King of Denmark, with the Queen, the Princess, and the whole Court, arrived at Fredericksberg; where his Majesty will stay till To-Morrow, and then remove to Fridensbourg, there to pass the Autumn. The 23d, Captain Kiarulf returned hither from Peterborough, whither he had been sent in a small Vessel. He reports, that the Russian Fleet is returned into Cronstot and Revel, to be laid up for the Winter. It is said Admiral Gabel has given Orders for the laying up of the Danish Fleet. The Transport Ships which brought hither Troops and Seamen from Norway, have actually received on Board their Stores of Provisions, and will put to Sea the first fair Wind to carry back those Forces.

Hague, Oct. 9, N. S. On the 4th Instant the Commissioners and Principal Officers of the several Admiralties took an Oath in Presence of the States General, to observe and see executed the new Tarif or Duties on Goods Imported or Exported; those of the Admiralty of Zealand excepted, the States of that Province refusing their Consent to this Tarif. The States of the Province of Holland are to assemble To-Morrow: General Hompesch with other General Officers whom they have sent for to consult, are arrived. We have Advice, that the Archdutchess passed through Mæstricht the 3d Instant, without making any Stop there. The Prince of Hesse with several other General Officers advanced out of the Town to meet her; and the whole Garrison under Arms lined the Streets through which she passed, the Artillery on the Ramparts firing. The States General having lately writen a Letter to the King of Sardinia, acknowledging him by that Title, the Chevalier Oforio, the Sardinian Minister, has delivered to their High Mightinesses the King his Master's Answer thereto.

The Clause in the Act of Parliament made in the 4th and 5th of Queen Anne, against Farming of Briefs.

And whereas there hath been an evil Practice in Farming and Purchasing for a Sum of Money the Charity Money that should or might be collected on any Brief or Briefs, to the very great Hindrance and Discouragement of Alms-giving on such Occasions; Be it therefore enacted by the Authority aforesaid, and it is hereby declar'd, That all Farming and Purchasing of such Charity Money is unlawful; and that if any Person or Persons shall purchase or agree for any Charity Money to be collected on any Briefs or Letters Patents, or by any Instrument of Covenant or Agreement by way of Farming, shall or may pretend to appropriate such Charity Money, or any Part thereof, to his or their Use, contrary to the Intent and Meaning of this Act, such Purchase and Instrument of Covenant and Agreement shall be void, and each Person agreeing to purchase the Benefit of such Brief, shall forfeit the Sum of 500 l. to be applied for the Benefit of the Sufferers in such Letters Patents mentioned, and to be recovered as before last mentioned.

Whereas it has been industriously reported, and very much credited by many Persons throughout the Kingdom, that an evil Custom has obtained of Farming all Briefs or Copies of Letters Patents granted under the Great Seal of Great Britain, for the Collecting Charity Money for Sufferers by Fire or otherwise, which Report hath tended to the manifest Detriment of such Collections: It has therefore been thought proper, for the obviating this Objection, to publish at large the Clause above-mentioned in the Act of Parliament made in the 4th and 5th Years of her late Majesty Q. Anne against such Custom of Farming the said Briefs. And to the End a due Discovery may be made of such irregular Practices, and the Imputation of Farming the said Briefs be effectually removed for the future, Notice is hereby given, That if any Person or Persons to whom such Letters Patents have been granted, or who have been any Way concerned in suing out the same, shall make full Proof, or produce any Contract for the Farming any such Brief or Briefs, such Person will not only be intitled to the above-mentioned Reward of 500 l. but shall, as a further Gratuity, receive the Sum of 100 l. to be paid by Mr. Ralph Paxton, at his Chambers in the Inner Temple-Lane.
