Madrid, October 15, N. S.

ON the 11th Instant the Duke of St. Blas, a Sicilian Nobleman, was married at St. Ildefonso to Donna Isabella Piscatori, who was divorced last Year from the Marquess de Monteleon's Son. She is Lady of Honour to the Queen of Spain, and the Duke of St. Blas has with her 10000 Spanish Pistoles, as also the Salary of a Councillour of the Indies, which is 600 Pistoles a Year; and it is said he will soon be made a Grandee of Spain. This Day their Catholick Majesties leave St. Ildefonso, in order to go to the Ecurial: They are to lye to Night at Sarzedilla, at the Foot of the Mountains of Guadarama, over which the Queen is to be carried by Chairmen: And To-Morrow their Catholick Majesties will arrive at the Ecurial. Letters from Cadiz advise, that the three Muscovite Ships which arrived there about six Weeks ago, are near laden, with Salt, Wine, Oyl, Raisins, Figs, and other Products of this Country. They are soon to sail for Petersbourg, but intend to winter in Iceland, in case they find they shall not be able to get home before the Frost in the Baltick.

Hague, Oct. 30, N. S. M. Hop, Treasurer General, Father of the Envoy of that Name to the King of Great Britain, died here on Saturday last, after two Days Illness. The same Day the States General declared M. Slingeland Treasurer General in his Room; and the Employment of the latter as Secretary to the Council of State, was likewise conferred upon M. Ten Hove Councillour of the Court of Justice. Yesterday 100 Soldiers marched from hence for Vianen, besides the Detachment which went thither with Count Hompefch: The Inhabitants of that Lordship, which is a Sovereignty, are to perform the Ceremony of swearing Allegiance and doing Homage to the States of Holland on Tuesday next. Count Konigseck, Envoy from the Emperour, arrived here last Sunday Night; and Yesterday made a Visit to the President for the Week of the Council of State; and was afterwards visited by most of the publick Ministers and others Persons of Distinction. To Day came Advice, that the Marquess de Berettilandi, formerly Ambassadour of Spain to this Republick and at Cambray, is dead at Brussels.

Gohra, Oct. 15, O. S. The King has not been a Hunting since Monday last, by reason of the Frost. His Majesty continues in a perfect State of Health, and took a Walk Yesterday in the Woods. The Duke and Dutchess of Blanckenbourg are expected here To-morrow.

General Post-Office, Oct. 7, 1725.

Whereas upon a strict Examination of the Rider, together with the Circumstances, which are since found to agree with his Relation, it does appear that the Cross-Road Mail which constantly goes between Chester and Exeter, was really taken a way from the Rider upon Sunday the 26th of September last, about Three a-Clock in the Morning, by two Men on Horseback, near Pensford, a Village about seven Miles from Bristol, in the Road to Wells, who carried off the entire Mail, which had in it the Bins of Letters of the several Towns of Chester, Whitechurch, Shrewsbury, Bridgnorth, Bewdley, Kidderminster, Worcester, Tewksbury, Gloucester, Wotton-Under-edge, Bristol, Wells, Bridgewater, Taunton, Wellington, Trericon and Exeter; and Expresses having been immediately, the very same Morning, sent away from Bristol to Chester and Exeter, to give Notice of the Accident to the several Post Towns mentioned, and their Dependents, and no Notice having been as yet sent to the General Post-Office at London, of any Bank Notes, or other Notes or Bills, that were in the said Mail, with Expressments upon them, according to the Method proposed in the next so long published in the Print,

it is to be presumed that there were no such Notes, or Bills in the said Mail. This is to advertise, that whoever shall apprehend the Persons who stole the Mail, or either of them, so that they, or either of them, be convicted of the Robbery, that over and above the Money they will be entitled to from the County where the Robbery was committed, they will also be entitled to the Reward of 200 l. for each of them. And also, if either of the said Persons who have committed the said Robbery, or any of their Accomplices, shall come in and make a Discovery of the said Robbery, so that they or either of them be apprehended and convicted thereof, such Person will not only be entitled to the Rewards abovementioned, but also to His Majesty's most gracious Pardon, as formerly published in the Gazettes by His Majesty's special Command.
