## Paris, October 19, N. S.

N the 17th Inftant the General Affembly of the Clergy here received a Letter from the King, commanding them to conclude the King, commanding them to conclude their Selfions that Day, and forbidding them to hold any other for deliberating upon any Church Affair, whether relating to the Bull Unigenitus or to any other Subject of Controverfy, on Pain of incur-ring his Majefty's Difpleafure in Cafe of Difbedience. And by the fame Letter, the Prelates who compose that Assembly, were ordered to retire forthwith to their respective Dioceses. The faid Assembly was defirous to continue their Sessions, under Pretence of cenfuring fome Propositions, and of fettling certain Points of Doctrine; and it was apprehended fuch Acts of theirs would in the Confequences have inflamed the prefent Divisions and created new Disputes to the Disturbance of the publick Quiet ; wherefore the King thought fit by hisLetter to order them to feparate. King Staniflaus hisLetter to order them to feparate. King Staniflaus went from Bouron to Bellegarde, a Seat of the Duke d'Antin's, and having paffed fome Days there, he proceeded to Chambord, where he ar-rived on the 24th. It is faid the King and Queen will leave Fontainebleau the 28th Inftant, pafs two Days at Petit Bourg, and arrive at Verfailles the 1ft of December. The Merchants of Paris and of the other principal Cities of the Kingdom, have lately prefented a Petition to the King, de-firing his Majefty either to fettle anew in an irrevocable Manner the India Company, or to re-flore the Freedom of Commerce as before that flore the Freedom of Commerce as before that Company was crefted.
