Their Excellencies the Lords Justices in Council.

It was this Day ordered by their Excellencies the Lords Justices in Council, That the Parliament which stands prorogued to Thursday the 11th of this Instant November, should be further prorogued to Thursday the 16th Day of December next.

Madrid, O^r. 29. N. S. Their Catholick Majesties are still at the *Escorial*; as yet it is not certainly known when they come to the Royal Palace here. On the 25th Instant, being the Queen of Spain's Birth-Day, who then entered into the 33d Year of her Age, a great Number of Grandees and Nobility appeared at Court at the *Escorial*, to congratulate her Catholick Majesty on the Day, and kissed her Hand. The Subscriptions for working the Silver and Gold Mines in *Andalusia* and *Eftremadura* being filled up, the Books for taking in the same were shut the 25th Instant; and the next Day the Subscribers who are possessed of 20 Shares, (according to the Rules set forth in their Project) had a Meeting, when they agreed upon several Matters concerning that Undertaking, in order to begin the working upon the said Mines with all possible Speed. Letters from *Malaga* of the 23d Instant advise, that the *Marquess Mari* came into that Port the Day before with two Spanish Men of War under his Command, and brought in as a Prize a *Sallee Rover* of 18 Guns and 120 Men, which the hard Westerly Winds had blown into the Straights on the *Barbary Coast*, where she was taken by the said *Marquess* as he came from chasing ashore the two Algerine Ships of 22 and 30 Guns near *Melilla*.

Gohre, O^r. 25. O. S. Yesterday *Baron Wallerode*, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of *Prussia* to His Majesty, arrived here from *Berlin*. *Count Staremberg*, Ambassadour from the *Empeour*, arrived here also from *Hambourg*, and is gone to *Hanover*, where he intends to reside till His Majesty's Return to *England*. The King hunted the Stag on Saturday last, as also this Day, and intends to go out again a Hunting on Wednesday next.
