Introduce a prohibition of Right Turn restriction during the hours of 8.00am to 10.00am and 4.30pm to 7.00pm, Monday to Saturday from Reede Road eastbound lane into the private access for the car park area of Lidl / Iceland on the south side of Reede Road 38 metres east of its junction with Heathway.
