AFTER several Conferences between the Deputies of the States General and those of the Province of Zealand, it has been agreed at the Request of the latter, to give that Province Time to the 17th of next Month, to take a final Resolution on the new Tariff or Rates on Goods imported or exported. On the 23d the States of the Province of Holland separated, and are to meet again the 6th of next Month. It is advised from Brussels, that the Beginning of this Month an Order was published by the Government there, for taking off the Confiscation of the Estates of those in the Austrian Netherlands, who followed the King of Spain's Party in the late War. That on the 11th Field-Marshal Count Daun received from Vienna the Emperour's Commission constituting him Governour General of the Milanese, and that his Excellency was making Preparations for his Journey thither.

Hanover, Nov. 12, O. S. The King left the Gohre Yesterday Morning, and the same Day arrived here between Four and Five in the Afternoon. His Majesty, and Prince Frederick, are in perfect Health.
