ON the 29th past the Council of State in a Body presented to the States General their Petition or Estimate and Establishment of War for the ensuing Year, to be sent to the Provinces, in order to have their Consent thereto. A Project of a Lottery for the Benefit of the Generality or State is under Consideration, and if it take Place all particular Lotteries of Provinces or Towns will be suppressed. M. Linden Governour of the young Prince of Nassau, is about to give up that Employment; finding himself obliged to reside sometimes in Guelderland sometimes here, for the Discharge of his new Office of President of the Nobility of the District of Nimeguen: It is not yet known by whom he will be succeeded as Governour of the Prince, who it is said is to come to Leyden next Spring, there to continue his Studies. The Great Pensionary has been indisposed these 8 or 10 Days, for which Reason the Assembly of the States of Holland which was to have been To-morrow, is put off to the 12th of this Month. M. Hop, late Ambassadour from the States at the Court of France, is returned hither; and after a few Days Stay will go to fix his Residence at Amsterdam.

Hanover, Nov. 19, O. S. This Morning died, in a very advanced Age, after a Week's Indisposition, the Marquess Marquetti, Envoy Extraordinary from the Duke of Parma to His Majesty. The Marquess de Cortanze, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Sardinia, has had an Audience of Leave of His Majesty, and intends very soon to return to Turin; and the Marquess d'Aix who succeeds him in that Character, has had his private Audience, at which he delivered his Credentials to His Majesty.
