Madrid, December 10, N. S.

N the 4th Inftant the Dutchefs of Offuna was brought to Bed of a Son, to the great Joy of the Duke her Husband, who had hitherto had no Male Iffue. Some Days fince the Count of Naffau Siegen arrived here from Flanders, he has not as yet been at Court, nor had an Audience of his Catholick Majefty. It is faid that he pretends to the Title of Highnefs, which the Court makes a Difficulty to grant. Last Sa-turday her Catholick Majesty went again to the Church of the Virgin de Atocha in a Chair, which her Majefty defigns to continue every Saturday, in order to perform her Devotions for obtaining a happy Delivery. His Catholick Majefty has been pleafed to offer to the Abbot Mongon, (late-ly arrived from Paris) the Employment of one of the Almoners to the Royal Chapel, but the faid Abbot has not accepted of it; and upon his Refufal faid, that he was not come hither with an Intention of getting Employments, but to live re-tired in Spain. He has had two Audiences of their Catholick Majesties. Letters from Genoa of the 20th Inftant bring Advice, that the Duke de Ripperda was arrived there from Vienna, and that he was to embark the next Day in one of the Republick of Genoa's Gallies in order to land at Barce-Iona, and to proceed hither. We have an Account from Cadiz, that on the 28th of November arrived there an Advice-Boat called the St. Francis Xavier, which came from Cartagena the 1st of August, and on the 17th of that Month put into the Havana, where the found two Ships ready laden and registred, and on the 13th of October they all three put to Sea together from thence. One of those two Ships was separated from the rest two Days after, but the Advice-Boat with the other entred the Harbour of Cadiz the 28th of Novem-ber. The Letters brought by this Advice-Boat relate, that all was very quiet in the Kingdom of Peru: Upon which this Court has fufpended the fending thither two Men of War which were fitting out at Cadiz, upon the Reports formerly fpread of an Infurrection in those Provinces.

Lisbon, Dec. 13, N. S. On the 30th of laft Month arrived here the Fleet from Pernambuco, confifting of 11 Sail of Merchant-Ships under the Convoy of the St. Lawrence Man of War:

Maranhaon. Some Days ago three Ruffian Ships put in here from Cadiz, and on the 7th Inftant proceeded on their Voyage homewards; failed alfo the fame Day a British Man of War for the Mediterranean. On the 8th failed out of this River, a Ship for Mina, one for Pernam-buco, two for the Babia, one for the Rio de Janeiro, two for Benguela, and one for Angola, all Portuguele laden with divers Goods, under the Convoy of one Man of War. Here lye ready to fail for the Rio de Janeiro 12 Ships, 9 others for the Bahia, and 1 for Angola.
