**B**Y a Sloop arrived here from the Coast of Guinea, the African Company has received Advice, that their Fort, which was abandoned some Time ago by their Soldiers and Factory, had been since entirely razed by the Dutch. On the 16th Instant was held a publick Act of Faith at the City of Evora by the Inquisition there, when 18 Persons were found guilty, two for having born false Witness, six for Polygamy, two for having made Superstitious Cures, two for having favoured Heretical Tenets, one for having had Converse with the Devil and given him a Writing signed with his own Blood, and five for Judaism. His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Greyhound, Captain Solegard Commander, is sailed for England, as will very speedily the Argyle Man of War, Captain Bowler.

*Helvoe sluys, Dec. 25, O. S.* The King left Haveron on Saturday last the 18th, and arrived at Vaert on Thursday Noon the 23d; His Majesty is hourly expected here. The Lord Viscount Townshend came hither Yesterday from the Hague.

*Whitehall, Dec. 28.* A Messenger arrived this Morning from Helvoetsluys, with an Account that His Majesty arrived there last Saturday about Two in the Afternoon, in order to imbarck alfoon as the Wind would permit.

*Dublin, Dec 18.* This Day his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant went in the usual State to the House of Peers, where being seated on the Throne his Excellency gave the Royal Assent to
