N the yath Inftant the Duke of. Riperda arrived here from Vienna by the Way of Genoa, where he embarked in the com-mon Packet-Boat, (the Captain of the Galley which was made ready by order of the Republick of Genoa for his Paffage, not being willing to ven-ture out to Sea by Reason of the bad Weather) and landed at Barcelona after a Voyage of five Days. The fame Evening he arrived here he went to the Palace, and was very gracioufly received by their Catholick Majefties, with whom he had an Hour's Conversation in their Closet. Two Days after his Catholick Majefty was pleased to declare the faid Duke a Secretary of State, with the Appoint-ments of two thousand Pistoles per Annum; but as yet he has not returned to Court to take Possession of that Employment, having been laid up with the Gout ever fince the Day after his Arvival. This Morning Sig. Canales, Ambaffadour from the Republick of Venice to this Court, made his Entry, and had his publick Andiences of their Catholick Majefties, the Prince of Afturias, and the Infantes. The Introductor of Ambaffadours, and feveral Gentlemen of the Court, went to his House on Horscback, where the Ambaffadour and his Retinue mounted on Horses sent to him from the King's Stable, and rode to the Palace, followed by one of the King's Coaches, four magnificent Coaches of the Ambasilidour's; and four of other foreign Ministers. His Excellency returned to his House in the King's Coach, and the Gentlemen of the Court, together with thole of the Ambaffidour, followed in the other Coaches.
