**T**HIS Day about Two in the Afternoon arrived a Messenger, dispatched by the Right Honourable the Lord Viscount Townshend from Rye, with an Account that Yesterday about Noon the King landed there in perfect Health (God be praised,) after a very troublesome Passage in stormy Weather. His Majesty came from Helvoetsluys on Saturday the 1st Instant, and Yesterday Morning at Day-Light the Yachts and Convoy were near Dover, and about Noon His Majesty came to Rye.
