THE Duke of Ripperda having taken Possession of his new Office in the Palace as Secretary of State, goes thither twice a Day for the Dispatch of Business. Their Catholick Majesties have fixed the 6th of next Month for going to the Pardo, where they design to pass some Weeks. The Count de Miranda, a Grandee of Spain, died some Days ago in the 70th Year of his Age, and is succeeded in his Titles and Estate by his eldest Son. Letters from Barcelona advise, that Count Konigseck the Emperour's Ambassadour to this Court, arrived there on the 22d Instant; where he designed to stay for some Days, and afterwards proceed hither.

Turin, Jan. 2, N. S. On the 31st past, the Count de Cambise Ambassadour from the most Christian King, made his Entry into this City, with a numerous Train of the King's Coaches, his own, and those of the Principal Nobility, and with a splendid Retinue; and Yesterday his Excellency had his publick Audience of the King and Queen.

This Day Sig. Claudio Re, Minister from the Duke of Parma, had his first private Audience of His Majesty, to which he was introduced by his Grace the Duke of Newcastle one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell, Kt. Master of the Ceremonies.
