His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State. Which Address His Majesty was pleased to reetive very graciously.

Madrid, Jon. 7, N. S. His Catholick Majefty has given Orders that all the Branches of the Revenue of the Crown, which have been hitherto managed by Administrators, shall from the Beginning of February next be farmed out to the belt Bidder, who is to pay a certain Sum by Way of Advance. The Marquess de Castelar, Secretary at War, is appointed his Catholick Majesty's Ambaffadour to the Republick of Venice, and the Affairs relating to the Army are put under the Direction of the Duke of Ripperda. His Catho-lick Majefty has declared by a Royal Decree, that all the Councils, Courts of Judicature, and Governours of Provinces and Towns, are to give firic Accounts of their Proceedings to the faid Duke, from whom they are to receive the neceffa-ty Orders. The Duke of Bannos who was named Ambaffadour Extraordinary to the King of Por-tugal, having defired Leave to be excufed going upon that Embaffy, his Catholick Majefty has granted his Requeft. No other Perfon is as yet appointed in his Stead, but it is reported that the Marquefs de Grimaldo is defigned for that Embaffy. Yefterday the Prince of Naffau Siegen had an Audience of his Catholick Majefty, who received him with great Marks of Diffinction, and his Catholick Majefty has been pleafed to grant him a Penlion of 3000 Piltoles per Annum. Letters from Barcelona advife, that Count Konig feck the Emperour's Ambafladour, who arrived there the 23d paft, was complimented by the Nobility, and the Governour fent a Company of Guards to do Duty at his Houfe, which he excu-fed himfelf from accepting. He fet out from thence the 27th paft to proceed hither by the Way

of Saragola, and is expected here the 12th Instant. Yesterday in the Asternoon their Catholick Mas jefties went to the Pardo, where they will flay fome Weeks ; the Queen was carried in a Chair j the Duke of Ripperda, the Marquels de Grimaldo, and the Marquels de la Paz, Secretaries of State, are also gone thither, and have their Offices there for the Dispatch of Business.
