Lisbon, February 9, N. S.

ON the 30th past arrived here a Dutch Man of War, with three Merchant-Ships under her Convoy from Amsterdam, in 13 Days. Advice being come from Madrid, that the Marquês de los Balbafes has been nominated Ambassadour at that Court, to come hither and demand the Infanta; the Marquês de Abrantes was on the 1st Instant declared Ambassadour Extraordinary with the like Commission to the Court of Madrid, and kissed his Majesty's Hand upon that Occasion. The Rio de Janeiro Fleet, which was appointed to sail upon the 17th past, under the Convoy of a Man of War, did not put to Sea till the 7th Instant: They were in all 14 Merchant-Ships for the Rio, and three for the Bahia; richly laden.
