HE. Heirs of the Great Admiral, and of the Constable of Castile, having applied to his Catholick Majesty to be restored to those two Dignities, which they forseited by following the Emperour's Party in the late Wars; his Catholick Majesty has declared by a Royal Decree (which was fent to the Council of Castile) that his Will is, not to revive those two Dignities. A new Regulation has been published by his Catholick Majesty's Order, for the Administration of his Treasury; by which all the Revenues of the Monarchy are to go through the Hands of the Treasurer-General, to be expended according to the King of Spain's Orders, which shall be given by the Duke of Riperial Don Antonio Sopenna is removed from his Employment of Secretary of the Marine and the Indies, and is declared Councilour of the Council of the Indies, with the same Appointments he had when Secretary, of 2000 Pistoles per Annum, and his Secretary's Office is annexed to that of the Duke of Ripperda.
