TH E Heirs of the Great Admiral, and of the Conftable of Caftile, having applied to his Catholick Majefty to be reftored to thofe two Dignities, which they forfeited by following the Emperour's Party in the late Wars; his Catholick Majefty has declared by a Royal Decree (which was fent to the Council of Caftile) that his Will is, not to revive thofe two Dignities. A new Regulation has been publifhed by his Catholick Majefty's Order, for the Administration of his Treafury; by which all the Revenues of the Monarchy are to go through the Hands of the Treafurer-General, to be expended according to the King of Spain's Orders, which fhall be given by the Duke of Ripperda. Don Antonio Sopenna is removed from his Employment of Secretary of the Marine and the Indies, and is declared Counfellour of the Council of the Indies, with the fame Appointments he had when Secretary, of 2000 Piftoles per Annum, and his Secretary's Office is annexed to that of the Duke of Ripperda. Don Jacobo Flon is removed from his Employment of Intendant General of the Revenues of Tobacco, and Don Geronimo Ozio who was his chief Clerk, is named in his Place. A Royal Decree has been publifhed in the Council of Finances, ordering the Rife of Pieces of Eight, American Coin, from eight Reals of Plate to nine and a half. Count Konigseck, the Emperour's Ambaffadour at this Court, is laid up with the Gout; and the Duke of Ripperda is alfo laid up with the fame Diftemper at the Pardo. Letters from Cadiz of the 5th Instant advife, that the four Spanifh Men of War, which were to have been ready for Service this Month, will fcarce be put to Sea till the End of next Month; and t another Dutch Man of War is joyned to miral Somerfydk's Squadron, which now confifts of feven in all.

Treafury-Chambers, Feb. 24. 1725-6.

The Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treafury, in purfuance of the Powers given them in the late Act of Parliament for raifing One Million by Way of Lottery, have been pleafed to order and direct the Purchase-Money for the Tickets in the faid
