St. James's, March 1.

THIS being the Birth-Day of Her Royal Highness the Princess of Wales, there was a very numerous and splendid Appearance at Court of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction: And at Night there were Illuminations, and other Publick Demonstrations of Joy.

Hague, March 8, N. S. M. Buys and M. Fabricius, were this Day named Secretaries of the Committeerde Raede, in the Room of the late M. de Beaumont. M. Ganfnot the Bavarian Minister had an Account last Night from Munich, that the Elector Maximilian died on the 26th of last Month in the Evening. We have Advice from Berlin, that the Princess Louise second Daughter of the Margrave Albert, died there the 20th inst, in the 17th Year of her Age. Orders are sent to Admiral Somersdyck to continue in the Mediteranean, and some more Ships of War are to be sent to reinforce his Squadron.
