(b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin.

(3) The variation from the standard weight will be measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogram of the coin.

(4) The design of the said silver coin shall be as follows:

'For the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription ". CHARLES III \cdot D \cdot G \cdot REX \cdot F \cdot D \cdot 50 PENCE $\cdot"$ and the date of the year, and for the reverse a depiction of Britannia with trident and shield accompanied by the inscriptions "BRITANNIA" and "1/4OZ 999 FINE SILVER" and the date of the year. The coin shall have a grained edae.

(5) The said silver coin shall be legal tender for the payment of any amount in anv part of Our United Kingdom.

TWENTY PENCE SILVER COIN

13. (1) A new coin of silver of the denomination of twenty pence shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 3.15 grammes, a standard diameter of 16.5 millimetres, a standard composition of not less than 999 parts per thousand fine silver, and being circular in shape.

(2) In the making of the said silver coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight or diameter specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:

(a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin of 0.036 grammes; and

(b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin.

(3) The variation from the standard weight will be measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogram of the coin.

(4) The design of the said silver coin shall be as follows:

'For the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription ". CHARLES III \cdot D \cdot G \cdot REX \cdot F \cdot D \cdot 20 PENCE $\cdot"$ and the date of the year, and for the reverse a depiction of Britannia with trident and shield accompanied by the inscriptions "BRITANNIA" and "1/100Z 999 FINE SILVER" and the date of the year. The coin shall have a arained edge.'

(5) The said silver coin shall be legal tender for the payment of any amount in any part of Our United Kingdom.

TEN PENCE SILVER COIN

14. (1) A new coin of silver of the denomination of ten pence shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 1.58 grammes, a standard diameter of 12 millimetres, a standard composition of not less than 999 parts per thousand fine silver, and being circular in shape.

(2) In the making of the said silver coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight or diameter specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:

(a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin of 0.024 grammes; and

(b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin.

(3) The variation from the standard weight will be measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogram of the coin.

(4) The design of the said silver coin shall be as follows:

'For the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription " \cdot CHARLES III \cdot D \cdot G \cdot REX \cdot F \cdot D \cdot 10 PENCE $\cdot"$ and the date of the year, and for the reverse a depiction of Britannia with trident and shield accompanied by the inscriptions "BRITANNIA" and "1/200Z 999 FINE SILVER" and the date of the year. The coin shall have a grained edge.'

(5) The said silver coin shall be legal tender for the payment of any amount in any part of Our United Kingdom.

FIVE PENCE SILVER COIN

15. (1) A new coin of silver of the denomination of five pence shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 0.8 grammes, a standard diameter of 8 millimetres, a standard composition of not less than 999 parts per thousand fine silver, and being circular in shape.

(2) In the making of the said silver coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight or diameter specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:

(a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin of 0.012 grammes; and

(b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin.

(3) The variation from the standard weight will be measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogram of the coin.

(4) The design of the said silver coin shall be as follows:

'For the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription " \cdot CHARLES III · D · G · REX · F · D · 5 PENCE ·" and the date of the year, and for the reverse a depiction of Britannia with trident and shield accompanied by the inscriptions "BRITANNIA" and "1/40OZ 999 FINE SILVER" and the date of the year. The coin shall have a grained edge.'

16. This Proclamation shall come into force on the seventh day of November Two thousand and twenty-four.
