THE Duke of Ripperda has formed a Plan for putting the Army upon a new footing: And accordingly his Catholick Majesty has already signed a Decree, ordering, that the Regiments of Foot shall consist of Two Thousand Men each, and those of Horfe of One Thousand each, to be commanded by General Officers; and that the Colonels and other Officers, who by this Means will be reformed, shall be provided (without assigning them Half-Pay) with the civil Governments of Towns, which shall be made Military, and be given to the said reformed Officers according to their Rank. On the 21st Instant a Courier arrived at the Pardo from Vienna; it is said he has brought the Pictures of the Emperour's Family. His Catholick Majesty has appointed Don Francisco Moreno (who lately came from Genoa, where he had lived some Years for having followed the Emperour's Party during the late Wars) to be Intendant-General of the Marine, as also President of the Contractation-House at Cadiz, with a Salary of 12000 Crowns a Year, in the Room of Don Joseph Patinno, who was lately made his Catholick Majesty's Minister at Brussels, and who is to set out for that Place the End of next Month. Yesterday in the Afternoon the King came hither from the Pardo to the Convent of St. Jerome, where he performed his Devotions for gaining the Indulgencies of the Jubilee, which was celebrated in that Convent; and in the Evening his Majesty went back to the Pardo. Letters from Cadiz of the 12th Instant advise, that two Register Ships bound for the Honduras in the West-Indies, carrying Packets of Letters from the Court, had put to Sea from thence, but were put back by contrary Winds.
