The Welsh Ministers propose to make an Order under section 247 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 ("the 1990 Act") to authorise the stopping up of the length of highway described in Schedule 1 to this Notice and to provide for the lengths of new highway described in Schedule 2 to this Notice.
